Tucson Community School Board of Trustees Application

Overview: The Board of Trustees shall support fund-raising activities of the school and shall assist in long-range planning. Trustees shall serve in an advisory capacity to the Board of Directors.

Members and Term: The Board of Trustees shall consist of nine persons serving staggered three-year terms. Each year, the term of one-third of the members shall expire and two members shall be appointed by the Board of Directors prior to the end of the school year and one member shall be elected by the Active Members at the annual meeting of members.

Meetings: Meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be held at least three times during the fiscal year and shall include at least one joint meeting with the Board of Directors during the school year. Trustees are expected to attend a majority of the Board of Trustees' meetings each year.
